## Kate has her own royal family

WHILE much has been made of royal girlfriend Kate Middleton's humble origins - her great-greatgrandfather was a miner - we can reveal that she is in fact of royal blood herself.

Kate, 25, who is hotly tipped to become Prince William's bride since the pair rekindled their on-off romance, is descended from the 14th-century monarch King Edward III and his wife Queen Philippa. And her descent can also be traced from Henry Percy, the 3rd Earl

of Northumberland. Because of these links, Kate and her sister Philippa, known as Pippa (was Kate's former air hostess mother Carole aware of the royal connection when she named her younger daughter?) can claim direct blood ties with every crowned head of Europe and the majority of the British peerage.

Our tame genealogist explains: "Kate's great-grandmother, Olive Lupton, an upper-middle-class Victorian woman, was 13 generations in descent from Henry

Percy, 3rd Earl of Northumberland. Olive was therefore 16 generations in descent from Edward III and Queen Philippa."

It also means that Kate and Pippa are kin of their friend George, Earl Percy, heir to the current Duke of Northumberland and the vast Alnwick Castle and London's Sion House.

Thomson was initially wary of


treading the boards but wrote eight sketches for the show.
